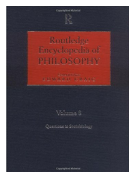

**Unique Metadata**

What makes *Reference Universe* unique is millions of index-level entries to subject encyclopedias; scholarly compendia; and handbooks. This content is “invisible” to OPAC or discovery layers, but unlocks thousands of titles otherwise missed.

**Direct Links**

In addition to print index-level data, all available metadata to e-Reference titles are also integrated. In this case, the link to the publisher site to retrieve the title, within the publishers own platform.
